





LOCAL NOTICE TO MARINERS

OREGON - WASHINGTON - IDAHO - Farewell to traditional nautical charts

NOAA is in the process of "sunsetting" or ending the production of traditional paper charts. However, even prior to traditional chart production ending, users may notice differences between paper charts and ENCs. There are two broad categories of data that are applied onto NOAA ENCs and paper / raster nautical charts – "Critical Corrections" and "Routine" data. Critical Corrections may be newly discovered shoals or other dangers to navigation, as well as changes in the positions or characteristics of aids to navigation (buoys, beacons, and lights). These are typically changes that are published by the Coast Guard in the weekly LNM. Critical corrections are applied to ENCs first, then applied to paper and raster nautical charts. These changes generally appear on both product types (raster and ENC) within a week of each other. However, new Routine source data are now ONLY applied to NOAA ENCs and not to traditional paper and raster nautical charts. Routine data includes the results of ordinary hydrographic and shoreline surveys, which could be extensive. Any specific dangers revealed during routine surveys are extracted from the data and classified as Critical Corrections to be applied to all products. WASHINGTON - PUGET SOUND - APPLE COVE TO KEYPORT - Submersible Vehicle testing


The Naval Undersea Warfare Center (NUWC) at Keyport, WA will be continuing operations in the vicinity of NUWC between University Point, the Brownsville Marina and Keyport through 23 Dec 2022. Operations will normally be conducted Monday through Friday during daylight hours. Operations will involve semisubmersible and submersible vehicles escorted by a small naval craft with a flashing red light. The small craft will monitor VHF-FM channels 12 and 16. The call sign for the small craft will be "Keyport Range Control". All craft transiting the area are requested to exercise caution and maintain a sharp lookout for possible semi-submerged vehicles while the range is in operation. Questions can be directed to Keyport Range Control on VHF-FM channels 12 and 16 or by contacting the Pacific Northwest Range Management and Ops Division, Range Control Branch, at (360) 396-2313.

WASHINGTON - GPS testing

US Strategic Command has proposed GPS testing encompassing the majority of Washington. The center point of the test will be near Selah, WA, at position 46-41-13.7 N, 120-10-21.8 W with a radius of 141 NM. The GPS navigation signal may be unreliable due to testing on GPS frequencies used by shipboard navigation and handheld systems. Systems that rely on GPS, such as e-911, AIS and DSC, may be affected. The testing frequency will be GPS L1/L2. The testing periods will be: 1701 on 27 May 22 until 1659 on 01 Jun 22 1701 on 16 Jun 22 until 1659 on 21 Jun 22 For additional information or to express concerns. contact the Coast Guard Navigation Center (703)313-5900 https://www.navcen.uscg.gov/?pageName=dgpsSiteInfo¤tOutages.

WASHINGTON – STRAIT OF JUAN DE FUCA TO STRAIT OF GEORGIA – SWINOMISH CHANNEL SOUTH ENTRANCE – Shoaling (Revised from LNM 14/22)

Significant shoaling exists in Swinomish Channel, especially the South Entrance between South Entrance Buoy 5 (LLNR 18802) and South Entrance Daybeacon 12 (LLNR 18812). The project depth of Swinomish Channel is 12 feet, however, the controlling depth of Swinomish Channel is 4.1 feet based upon the latest available hydrographic data. This controlling depth of 4.1 feet is reflected on NOAA ENC products. Raster products do not reflect this sounding information, as they are no longer being updated with most routine corrections. Mariners should consult ENC cells for the most up-to-date information. Mariners should transit the Swinomish Channel waterway with caution, especially at low tidal conditions. CHART 18427

Hello Everyone. This is your last chance to get in on the Land Yacht Rendezvous. We need your RSVP by Friday May 13 to ensure we have enough for everyone. The club is providing hamburgers, hot dogs, buns, and non-alcoholic beverages. We have 10 pounds of homemade brautwurst to share. You bring your favorite BBQ side dish such as potato salad, macaroni salad, green salad, baked beans, chili, bean salad or dessert, or whatever you like to eat at a gathering.

We will have giveaway items, as well as 5 wooded acres to roam around if you wish. Other activities will include corn boards, red neck golf, a horseshoe pit, brain teaser puzzles, a pool table, and my antique farm tractors on display. You may also just sit and visit with new and old friends while making s'mores over a fire.

But you need to get your RSVP in ASAP. Call us at the Phone # at the bottom or e-mail. If you call and we are outside just leave a message. Our phone is a land line with answering machine (cell phone coverage is spotty out here). Then all you have to do is get here using the following directions.

From Interstate 5

Southbound or Norhtbound take Exit 109 (Martin Way / College Street). Turn West and go very short distance to College Street. Turn left on College Street and drive all the way through Lacey 4.7 miles.

As you are leaving the city limits of Lacey you will pass under a railroad bridge, and the street becomes known as Rainier Road. Continue driving East on Rainier Road for 7.4 miles passing through the Southernmost portion of JBLM. As you exit JBLM area you will cross over Military Road where there is a yellow flashing light. As you continue straight through the intersection, we are .2 miles down the road on the right. Faircourt Lane is not well marked and easy to miss, so start slowing down when you see our neighbors white board fence and turn right at the end of it. We are the second house down on the right. It will be well marked with a vessel safety check banner.

From the Roy Y

Take Hwy 507 through JBLM into Roy and Mckenna. Crossover the Nisqually river and drive into Yelm on 507. At the 5th stop light turn left and head South, (still on 507) 5 miles into Rainier. As you enter Rainier there are 2 gas stations on the right-hand side of 507. Go past the first one, a Chevron station. One block later is a Shell station mini mart. Turn right at the intersection of the Shell station.

In 2 blocks you will pass under a railroad trestle. Be aware it is a 1 lane road under the trestle because it is so narrow. Traffic alternates going through taking turns. Follow the road up the hill and around the bend, Faircourt Lane is 1.9 miles from the Shell station on the left-hand side. The street is hard to see until the last minute, so start looking for our neighbor's white board fence and turn just BEFORE it. We are the second house down on the right side and will have the VSC banner on the gate.

The Stones arrived in the Tacoma Yacht Club basin the morning of Friday, April 22 and were berthed in the waterway adjacent to B dock. It was their first experience bringing a boat into the basin but maneuvered safely and well into position.

The next day, the work crew of volunteers appeared and begin planning for the day. Cdr Stan (SN-CN) and Debbie Wolfe brought over the TPS supply of silk flowers and bows, then picked up the fresh daffodils, all to be attached to Barnacle Betsy. A new addition to our decorating ensemble was a dozen corrugated, wax coated cardboard daffodil shaped forms donated by our members from the former Olympia Power Squadron. We thank P/C Chuck (AP) and P/C Viki (S) Sharp for storing these forms for the past several years. They are a wonderful addition to our repertoire. 


