# Avoiding collisions between boats and kayaks

When you're boating, you can take steps to avoid collisions between boats and kayaks. An expert research article, "Visibility Factors in Small Boat Collisions," offered some good suggestions on how to avoid running over kayaks and small boats and also how to avoid being run over in smaller boats and kayaks.

The researchers made suggestions based on a series of on-the-water tests using volunteers in kayaks and powerboats. Researchers found that kayaks aren't likely to be spotted by powerboats until they're a quarter of a mile away. The sooner a small vessel is spotted, the better.

Seventy-five percent of powerboat operators reported first seeing "paddle flash" when they saw the vessel. A white or light-colored paddle blade was much easier to see than a dark blade. The remaining 25 percent saw the luminous jersey worn by the volunteers. Consider adding paddle tip reflectors to your paddle tips.

Experts recommend that kayakers:

- carry an audible signaling device,
- wear fluorescent life vests or shirts,
- use paddles with white or light-colored blades,
- avoid kayaking in areas with high boat traffic, and
- use flags that can be mounted on kayaks.

Owners of larger boats should:

- wear sunglasses,
- keep a proper lookout, and
- be especially alert in areas where they are likely to encounter smaller craft.


