COMMANDER



Delieve it or not, I'm at a loss for words this month. Typically an idea makes itself know to me, but this month NOTHING. So I went looking for ideas. I found the following "Cold Water Boating" information on the "North American Safe Boating Campaign" website. Even with summer coming NW boaters are on COLD waters year around. I thought this was a timely reminder.

Note the 1-10-1 rule under "Stages of Cold Water Immersion". When you go into cold water you have 1 minute to get yourself under control, 10 minutes to get yourself out of the water, and 1 hour until you're unconscious. This is true in the water temperatures around the Pacific Northwest. Wearing a lifejacket will make a big difference. If you go into the water without wearing your lifejacket, you're going to be in trouble before you'll be able to get it on. So wear your lifejacket. I've already lost too many friends to drowning.

COLD WATER BOATING

Cold-water immersion is the cause of many boating-related fatalities. The danger increases as water temperature decreases below normal body temperature (98.6 degrees F).

DOS AND DON'TS OF COLD WATER BOATING

- Do make sure everyone is wearing a life jacket. Even experienced swimmers will experience shock within one minute in the frigid water and lose muscle control within 10 minutes.
- Do file a float plan with someone you trust that includes details about the trip, boat, persons, towing or trailer vehicle, communication equipment, and emergency contacts.
- Do dress properly for the weather, always wearing layers, and bring an extra set of clothes in case you get wet. Remember, dress for the water temperature, not the air temperature.
- Do use your navigation lights to alert other boaters to your presence in dark and/or foggy conditions.
- Do catch your breath. A sudden unexpected fall into cold water causes an involuntary gasp (or torso) reflex. It takes less than ½ cup of water in your lungs to drown. If you remain calm, you have a greater chance of self-rescue.
- Don't panic if you fall into the water. Stay afloat with the help of your life jacket, regain control of your breathing, and keep your head above water in vision of rescuers.

- Don't keep on heavy boots if you're in the water. Look for ways to increase your buoyancy. If you're in the water with others, huddle together with everyone facing inwards to help everyone stay afloat and keep warm.
- Don't apply heat to extremities like arms and legs of a rescued victim. This sudden change in temperature could cause cardiac arrest.

STAGES OF COLD-WATER IMMERSION

- Cold shock. You have one minute to adjust to the cold shock response don't panic.
- Swimming failure. You have 10-minutes of meaningful movement to get help and get out of the water.
- You have about one hour before you become unconscious from hypothermia.
- Post-rescue collapse. You "give up" and collapse after or right at the time of rescue.



Great tips! A well-tied cleat hitch keeps your boat secure—no drifting, no worries! Whether you're docking or mooring, this simple but essential knot ensures stability. Not sure how to tie it? Follow these easy steps:

- 1 □Wrap the rope under the cleat and pull it snug.
- 2 Cross the rope over the cleat, then loop it under the opposite arm.
- 3 □Repeat the figure-eight pattern.
- 4 \Box Lock it with a final tug.




