ne of the things that I enjoy doing with the Power Squadron is teaching the first chapter in the ABC course and the Seamanship course. One thing that I talk about is the importance of doing an engine room check

(all the fluids, belts, etc.) before starting the engine, leaving the engine room door open while starting the engine and then doing a second engine room check. Recently, Brenda and I had spent the night at Arabella's in Gig Harbor and were getting ready to head back to our marina. The first engine check went well. The engine started just as it should. When conducting the second engine inspection I notice a slow drip that should not be there. The "taste test" revealed the drip was salt water. There was an issue with the raw water pump. The second engine room check kept us from having a major mechanical issue in the Tacoma Narrows. The moral of the story is make sure you do an engine inspection before and after starting your boat motor!!

My guess is that most of you are aware of the collision of the Washington State ferry with the motor vessel "Nap Time." I used the video of that collision for the Seamanship class session on the COLREGS and we discussed which of the rules were broken that day. In doing research for the class I check on several boating forums where a discussion of the collision had taken place. It became clear that MOST boaters have no idea of COLREGS and the various rules!!! Regularly review the COLREGS. Keep a copy of "The One-Minute Guide to the Nautical Rules of the Road" by Charlie Wing near your boat's helm. However, never assume that the boaters near you know and follow the COLREGS. Be safe out there.

The boating season is upon us and that means rendezvous season is here. Check out article in this edition of *The Wake Astern* to find out about the upcoming rendezvous.

Richard Mattox, editor of *The Wake Astern*, emailed information to everyone concerning the upcoming San Juan Island Summer Cruise. Make plans to take part in the cruise. 

We are planning to do an Engine Maintenance Class with various expert members instructing the chapter subjects. I think it will work quite well. The starting date will be Wednesday, March 22, 2017. The classroom site will be Orchard Park Rehab at 4755 So. 48th St. Tacoma, WA 98419 in South Tacoma. We have a good signup thus far. Please contact me if you are interested in the class. I will be ordering materials soon.

PLEASE NOTE! I am looking for a member who can set up and operate the power point equipment for this class. This would only involve the operation of the equipment, while other instructors do the presentations. This is a great way to earn a "Merit Mark" while helping the Squadron. It was also discussed that Tacoma Power Squadron's certified Boat Operator Instructors could do some on the water demonstrations and training to interested individuals there at the Pt Defiance Boat House facility. This can give the Power Squadrons additional exposure to our fellow boaters, and may result in added members.

There will be an ABC Class at the Pt. Defiance Boat House starting on Wednesday May 03, 2017 running for 5 weeks. This class is open to anyone interested in attending. There is a tentative plan to do another ABC Class in early June as well. The exact dates will be determined soon. Our member's help is always appreciated for these classes.



This report is published with permission of Past Commodore Day Island Yacht Club Chuck Gay. These reports will keep us updated on the current Washington legislation regarding area boaters.

RBAW has several major items in the proposed State of Washington 2017-2019 biennium budget that will closely watched. These include the Boating Facilities Program, Clean Vessel Pump-outs, and Boating Infrastructure Grants. These budget items, totaling in excess of \$21.9 million, are funded by a combination of user fee collections, state tax revenues and federal pass-through funds.

The Puget Sound No-Discharge Zone (NDZ) is still an issue being watched very closely by many interested parties. A special meeting was called by the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in December 2016 by the Region 10 Director Dennis McLerran. This session explored potential alternatives to the full NDZ requested by the State Dept. of Ecology (DOE). Unfortunately, those tended to be less about a targeted NDZ than about DOE's hope for some "off ramps" to full compliance. It is believed there is some chance – however remote – that the DOE will pull back its initial petition in hopes of negotiating a "we can live with it" version with the maritime community. However, the environmental community is unlikely to accept that. There also remained the possibility that EPA Director McLerran would bend to the great political pressure being discussed and signoff on the NDZ petition prior to his leaving office on January 20, 2017.

The new Dept. of Natural Resources (DNR) Director, Hilary Franz, met with maritime interests, including all groups interfacing with the Aquatics Division, especially regarding leasing from DNR. Ms. Franz was genuinely interested to establish "solutions" to vexing problems in the leasing process and policies and confirmed she sees "economic development" to hold as much weight as "environmental stewardship" in her directives to DNR staff.

DNR staff, led by Kristen Swenddal, Division Manager, Aquatic Resource Division, made a presentation at the January, 2017, Board Meeting about the policies and procedures surrounding the typical lease provisions that DNR puts in its Aquatic Lands Leases. While not directly affecting organizations which own tide lands (like DIYC) it provided a very good background for the leasing process with DNR.

Washington State Parks will be pursuing bills related to boating safety this session; one will permit law enforcement to impound a vessel with impaired operators, so long as the impound is a last resort if no other on-board operators can drive; and another bill that makes technical fixes to the Boater Education Card statute. On a related front, a bill which will clean up unintended consequences from a previous gun background check initiative has been filed by Washington Ceasefire.

On January 12, RBAW representatives met with DOL on recent Hull Identification Numbers (HIN) changes during re-titling. This process is not being instigated at the State level, but instead is a Federal unfunded MANDATE THAT states must <u>confirm</u> starting January 1, 2017, that each and every registered vessel has a HIN that conforms EXACTLY to one of three allowed formats. This mandate has been in discussion since 2010. DOL was very glad to have the discussion which resulted in a proposed website notice, which may be seen on the RBAW website at <u>www.rbaw.org</u>. RBAW does not see any further involvement in this matter except to spread the word regarding re-titling.
