USPS's alternative name America's Boating Club® objective is to attract an additional demographic of boaters. This includes people with smaller boats and paddle craft. These craft provide relatively simple, safe, and affordable ways for people to get into boating. This demographic of boaters may lack familiarity with what is involved. By reaching out to those typically new and younger boaters we provide them opportunities to grow in their boating skills and enjoyment. This stretching of our reach matches well with my motto of "Partner, Outreach, Knowledge".

"Partner" allows more "Outreach" leading to boarder "Knowledge" and from "Knowledge" comes increased "Outreach" gaining more "Partners". When it is properly working it is a two-way street continuing to repeat over time.

- Partner Find groups and/or people with an interest in boating. Not all of them will think of themselves as being "boaters". They could be using boats in some other activity. They could be canoers, kayakers, paddle boarders, fisherman/women, hunters, divers, and etc. Places you're likely to find these groups and people are places like clubs, city/county Parks/Rec, YMCA, youth groups, scouts, and etc. By developing partners we're able to more efficiently create a bigger outreach influence on improving RBS.
- Outreach When we find out about a possible Partner we approach the relationship from the perspective of "How can we better work together and/or support each other?" Like dating, it is a long term process to establish a relationship. With time & learning you develop an understanding how the partner works and their needs/wishes. From outreach the partners share knowledge on improving RBS.
- Knowledge With an understanding of the partnership's needs/wishes knowledge begins to flow. This is when people see value in establishing a partner relationship. Part of this is the willingness to take proposals/questions/requests/etc. back to your group. When this happens things really begin to open up. The partners begin sharing knowledge that benefits both. Knowledge develops a common ground for increased RBS improvements and fellowship.

From the Knowledge gained additional opportunities arise for Outreach which will lead to new Partners. Beginning the process over.

By reaching out to these alternative boaters we will gain more. Most of us began by playing with inexpensive smaller boats for diverse reasons. And developed our skills and passion for boating by Partnering. Experienced boaters expand their horizons by creating a passion for others to grow their Knowledge. America's Boating Club® provides the opportunity for people to Partner together increasing Outreach to improve Knowledge, in a safe and friendly environment. With this, growth will occur.

University of Wisconsin study on "Friendship: making friends and extending friendships". It surmised that it takes right around 50 hours of interaction with a person to develop a casual friendship; not all at once, but through reasonably steady interaction. The study pointed out that it takes around 100 hours of proximity and interaction to actually develop a cordial friendship; after 200 hours of interaction the friendship moves to the beginning stages of a close friendship.

Communication brings education, education brings awareness, awareness lessens fear and the lack of fear prevents conflict.

Build strength on strength. Sharpen & accelerate to win. Sharpening our competitive edge...the best getting better. Simplify & enable our teams. Listen to our customers, may not agree or like what they say, but it represents the truth. Our people are our #1 asset & ability to work better together as a team. Listen & understand what the partner's wants/needs/limitations are.

According to BoatUS all recreational boating organizations combined are only reaching 3% of the boating community with our public education classes. It's silly to think of ourselves as being in competition for that 3%. Rather we need to start viewing ourselves as partners in reaching out to the other 97% of the boating public, many of whom do not know we exist.

According to BoatUS 85% of the recreational boating community does not know we exist.

class is for all ages and qualifies for the Washington State Boaters card when passed. If you scourse pass the information on


know anyone who needs this course pass the information on.


