Dome are aware I'm a maritime historian and collector. And I love a good sea story. Here is a short historical sea story involving Tacoma Power Squadron.

I decided to share this after noticing Tacoma Yacht Club's (TYC) signal cannon was donated to TYC by the Tacoma Power Squadron (TPS) in June of 1973. I noticed this cannon and donation plaque while attending TYC's Daffodil Marine Festival. It reminded me that there is a long historical connection between TYC and TPS of sharing Partner[ship], Outreach, and Knowledge.

In 1939 Robert Bourdon served as the Commodore of the Tacoma Yacht Club. It is said that Bourdon had access to USPS literature and was sufficiently impressed by the literature to begin a squadron.

On August 22, 1939, the "Tacoma Power Squadron" was granted it's "Local Squadron Charter". The Charter was signed by the USPS Chief Commander, Arthur Middleton, N. The charter members were Victor E. England, Albert L. Hale Jr, Charles G. Martin, Ralph N. Peterson, Clyde M. Hunt, I. J. Leonard, Theodore E. Worthington, R. [Robert] C. Bourdon, Bert Bradley, E. C. Cooney, and Lorenzo Mansfield. All TPS charter members were members of TYC. The Tacoma Power Squadron was the first squadron on the Pacific coast.

Bourdon promoted the chartering of TPS and served as TPS's first Commander. Martin was elected the Vice-Commander & Hunt the Secretary/Treasurer.

During World War II, Robert Bourdon served countless hours on patrol duty and as the Vice Commander in Flotilla 41 [Tacoma] of the US Coast Guard Reserve (T) [Auxiliary]. Most of TPS members were members of various USCG Reserve (T) Flotillas, around the Pacific Northwest, serving on patrol duty and/or teaching Seamanship and Piloting classes. In December 1943 P/C Bourdon called a meeting, at the Governor Hotel in Olympia, to explore the feasibility of a separate northwest district. District 16 was chartered by the USPS Governing Board in February 1944. District 16 was comprised of the Portland, Seattle, and Tacoma squadrons. It was voted that P/C Bourdon, AP be appointed Rear [District] Commander of District 16 (appointed for 1944/45, 1945/46, and 1946/47). Bourdon is referred to as the "Founding Father of District 16". Therefore, Tacoma was instrumental in the formation and leadership of District 16.

In January 1946, Bourdon was the first member of District 16 to attend, in person, the USPS National Meeting. Over the years there has been a close relationship between TYC and TPS. TPS meetings and classes were held at TYC. Following District Conferences, held at TYC, Predicted Log races were held on Commencement Bay. Talking about Predicted Log races, another interesting bit of information is that TPS member P/D/EO Neil Armstrong (DEO 55/56 & 56/57) is called the "Father of Predicted Log racing".

Tacoma Power Squadron members continue to Partner with other organizations, increasing the Outreach, to better spread the Knowledge of recreational boating safety (see my 1st Commander's article, in the Wake Astern, about my motto of Partner, Outreach, and Knowledge). To date the Partner[ship] and Outreach between TYC and TPS continues to spread boating skills & Knowledge. And expanding Partner, Outreach, and Knowledge; TPS continues to have members that are members of USCG Auxiliary and members that do Vessel Safety Checks (VSC), in partnership with the Auxiliary.

### **Tacoma Power Squadron attended the Daffodil Marine Parade** 2025

America's Boating Club of Tacoma and South Puget Sound participated in the 2025 Daffodil Marine Parade hosted by Tacoma Yacht Club, April 11-13. This year's theme was, "Boating Locally," and TPS well represented that theme.

Daffodil is a multi-day event spanning Friday through Sunday following nearly a year of preparation by Tacoma Yacht Club. Our club's involvement begins with the decision to participate, select a boat to serve as our focal point, then decide which category we will enter in competition. There are many activities that occur during the three day event, but our focus is decorating a boat and advertising our mission of providing safe boating education to the public. This year, Brian and Barbara Prudente graciously provided Sjøen, their 42-foot Kady-Krogen as the TPS theme boat.

Friday, April 11, Brian maneuvered Sjøen through the narrow channel between the boats tied off to B and C docks aided by crew member Lt Tom Ferree, JN. They were met there by Stan and Debbie Wolfe who had picked up and delivered the club's Daffodil decorations kept in rented storage. Sjøen was moored in one of the boathouses made available for such use by the generous members of TYC. After rigging boarding accommodations, the boat was ready for Saturday's decorating party.

Saturday's weather was very comfortable, with sun and slightly cool temperatures. The work party started forming at 10:00 AM. This year the club opted to not purchase and use fresh daffodils, instead relying on the boxes of artificial flowers and bows we have. After a donut, or two, grapes, muffins, and coffee, work started with hanging our educational banner. Work then proceeded down the starboard side from bow to stern with artificial daffodils, bows of daffodils, and large picture boards of daffodils. With all the hands available, work was completed by 1:00 PM. Many of the folks then went up to the TYC Clubhouse for a lunch buffet.

At 10:00 AM, our Commander, Craig Brown, represented TPS during the Flag Ceremony at the TYC Clubhouse deck. Departure from the boathouse began around 11:30 AM with a full crew: Skipper Brian Prudente, Host Barbara Prudente and Flag Lieutenant Mason Dixon, Craig Brown, Jackie and Richard Mattox, Becky Arrington and Richard Sumpter.

Our "Boating Locally" theme reflected some of the common activities we do or experience while boating local waters. Craig was in his foul weather gear standing at the bow as lookout under cloud balloons while Mason sprayed "rain" on him portraying our rainy and foggy weather. Jackie, wearing a "crab" hat was crabbing while both Richard & Richard were salmon fishing complete with a large a large "stuffed" salmon. Beckie was sun-bathing underneath a tethered "sun" balloon. Tacoma and SJØEN placed third with our entry in the Theme category. Great job everyone!
